Ginkgo Foundation, founded on July 20th in 2015, is a private foundation registered with the Bureau of Civil Affairs of Beijing. It was founded by Ginkgo Fellows, Narada Foundation, Zhejiang Dunhe Foundation, XinHe Foundation (formerly XinPing Foundation), and NPO Research Center in Renmin University of China.

Our mission is to nurture a strong, diverse, and vibrant core community of social entrepreneurs that will help catalyze positive social change and development in Chinese society. We envision a world where each individual is able to live with dignity and freedom of choice, where each community is able to self-organize in the face of challenges, and where human race and nature thrive in harmony.

Ginkgo Foundation is such a special existence that we'd better regard it as a place to assemble talents rather than a place to gather money. By the end of 2017, Ginkgo Fellows had span over 23 provinces across the country and been active in their own communities while staying connected to this nationwide network.

Ginkgo Fellow Program Activities in 2017

Introduction

Ginkgo Fellow Program (below as program) is a long-term program investing in human capital in the nonprofit sector. The Program invests in young social entrepreneurs, helping them achieve greater personal and career breakthroughs. Our fellows include NGO founders and leaders, as well as promising individuals from media, academia, and related sectors.

To address the common difficulties faced by social entrepreneurs, the program offers each fellow a grant of RMB100,000 per year for 3 consecutive years, and also supports their professional developments through biannual networking activities and overseas learning expeditions.

Since 2010, the program has supported 114 fellows from 23 provinces. They work in 11 different fields, including education, environmental protection, public health and rural development. Fellows learn from one another in an equal, respectful, diversified and open-minded environment, expanding their horizons and improving their professional skills. We believe that they will greatly contribute to the harmonious and sustainable development of the society.





On-site Interviews

In April and May, the selection panel conducted a preliminary survey of all candidates and updated the information of 166 candidates. From June to September, 27 candidates from 11 provinces were investigated in the field by the panel who trekked nearly 50,000 kilometers and spent an average of 120 hours getting to know each candidate.

Final Expert Panel Review

In November, the final review was held in Beijing, where an one-on-one interview was held between a panel of 9 experts and 16 final candidates. In the end, all 16 candidates were selected to be the Ginkgo Fellow class of 2017. At the same time, the expert panel also helped the candidates reflect upon their works and personal missions. The 9 members on the expert panel are (in alphabetical order of last name) Yimei Chen, Patrick Cheung, Yongping He, Xiaogang Liu, Chao Lv, Zhi Lv, June Pu, Haiguang Wang and Shouli Zhang.

Community Building

In addition to receiving the 100,000 RMB grant per year for 3 consecutive years, Ginkgo Fellows also benefit from being a part of an inclusive and collaborative community. The community holds a series of events annually, including spring retreat, annual conference, overseas learning expeditions, and a Fellow Collaboration Fund.

Ginkgo Fellow Spring Retreat

The purpose of the spring retreat is to connect fellows, to promote friendship, collaboration, and a sense of community. During March 17th -19the, a total of 59 Fellows participated in the spring retreat held in Guangzhou. Activities during the retreat included Peer Advisory Group workshops, life story sharing, and discussions around social issues. During the retreat, the secretariat team and the Ginkgo Fellow Committee reported their works to Ginkgo Fellows. Besides, the fellows also selected 12 Collaboration Fund projects and two destinations of overseas learning expedition by voting.

Joint Meetings between Secretariat and Ginkgo Fellow Committee

From March to October, the Secretariat team and Ginkgo Fellow Committee held five joint meetings, in which an in-depth discussion was conducted with regard to Ginkgo Communitie's values and current development, and responsibilities of the Secretariat and Ginkgo Fellow Committee respectively. Through the collaboration between Secretariat and the Committee on a Community Newsletter and one-on-one telephone interviews to Ginkgo Fellows, the vitality within the Gingko Community was greatly enhanced.

The Third Ginkgo Annual Conference

From November 4th to 6th, 76 Ginkgo Fellows participated in the third Ginkgo Annual Conference held in Beijing. Focusing on the theme "Grow With You", the meeting reviewed the development of Ginkgo Foundation since its establishment in 2015. With more and more Fellows identifying with Ginkgo Fellowship, they became more active in the development and improvement of Collaboration Fund and overseas learning expeditions. There was increased enthusiasm to run for membership on the Sixth Ginkgo Fellow Committee, and for the opportunity to host the 2018 spring retreat. In addition, the annual conference discussed the future of Ginkgo Fellow Program, Ginkgo Community and Ginkgo Foundation in form of the World Café, and made suggestions to Ginkgo Foundation's board of directors.



Overseas Learning Expeditions

Overseas learning expeditions are the most anticipated community activities each year. Fellows return from these expeditions with broadened horizons, new perspectives and potentials for global collaborations.

With the funding from Xinhe Foundation, Ginkgo Fellows took expeditions to Northern Europe and Australia in 2017. From June 20th to 30th, 18 Fellows visited Finland and Sweden, including 15 organizations such as Studio Aalto, Etana Editions, Haltia and Porvoo. The theme of this expedition was "Experience Social Equity and Innovation in Nature".

Focusing on environment protection and community development, 18 other fellows visited Australia from September 12th to 23rd. They visited several organizations such as Penguin Conservation Center in Phillip Island, Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation Center in Sylwirs, South Australian Autism Society, Unley Elementary School in Adelaide, Maritime Education Center in Griffith University, and Sydney Ecological villages.

Collaboration Fund

Launched and funded by Ginkgo Fellows in 2015, Collaboration Fund is geared towards promoting cooperation and innovation among fellows to achieve collective impact on a shared social goal. Rules stipulations, and disbursement of the fund are all set and managed by a work group of Gingko Fellows. Seven new projects were granted by community voting launched in 2017, covering areas such as capacity building, fundraising, and volunteer management. A total grant given for these projects approximately amounted to 270,000 RMB was made, involving 25 Fellows. By the end of 2017, Collaboration Fund has supported a total of 27 projects, 18 of which had been completed and 9 were in process.

In June, after a collective online voting process, the fourthterm work group was elected. The five numbers of the group are: Jin Liao (President), Qian Jiang (Vice President), Tsering drolma, Jing Xiao, Lixia Qi.

You-Talent Projec



Introduction

Launched and funded by Dunhe Foundation in 2014, You-Talent Program helps social organizations in recruiting and cultivating talented professionals interested in social sector careers, particularly with regards to communication and fundraising.

The project offers RMB 100,000 per year for 3 consecutive years to selecte Ginkgo Fellow organizations to hire full-time staff in key positions and to cultivate talents in communication and promotion.

You-Talent Project Activities in 2017

In 2017, 8 new organizations joined You-Talent Project, and the total number of organizations benefiting from this project reached to 32. Over the past three years, You-Talent Project has allocated a total of RMB 5.9 million for grants to help fundraising and advertising.

Promoting Co-creation and Clarifying Responsibilities

From May 22nd to 23rd, leaders from 31 You-Talent organizations participated in a workshop that focused on "Co-creation for joint public campaigns" in Hangzhou, with the goal of establishing a collaborative network of You-Talent organizations. Ginkgo Foundation played the role of the supportive platform on which organizational boundaries are broken and resources are integrated, and ultimately faciliated a successful joint public campaign in Auguest of 2017.

Introducing Effective Leadership Training Tools

In May 2017, a Peer Advisory Group Facilitator Training was held in Shanghai. Fifteen NGO leaders from the You-Talent Project practiced problem solving and peer communication tools, such as the 7-Step Problem Solving Framwork and World Café, under the guidance of expert peer advisory group trainer Mr. Yongping He.

In December, You-Talent Project set up a Peer Advisory Group workshop for Ginkgo Fellows, which not only helped 4 fellows facing real challenges, but also benefited more than 40 other participants through the process. Over half of the participants expressed their desire to conduct regular Peer Advisory Group in the future.

"I learned a lot from the Peer Advisory Group Facilitator Training. And when I applied what I've learned to team building efforts later on, things worked out very well. I also successfully organized Peer Advisory Group events in Huiling headquarters and with Shanxi colleagues to help them face their problems and enhance their leadership."

Contextualizing Learning and Improving Fundraising

In July and August, You-Talent Project conducted an online training course to help participants improve their online fundraising strategies. Under the guidance of senior trainers, 23 fellows completed 20 fundraising text within 4 weeks, which were successfully applied to "9.9 Philanthropy Day" and Ginkgo Photo Story Project.

Introducing Team Management Tools

In 2017, You-Talent Project developed "Co-Xing Project (stage II)" with an expert management adviser and provided a year-long training for five organizations. In April and December, the Project held 2-day training events in Beijing and Henan Jiaozuo respectively, teaching members to use tools for team reflection, role analysis, and organizational culture building. The participating teams also received training and one-on-one tutorship in leadership and organizational development during the project.







Introduction

Founded by Ginkgo Foundation, Grit Project provides gap-year experiential learning opportunities to youths. The first pilot project was set up in 2016 with the focus on service learning, with professional training and reallife work opportunities. The Project is intended to help students dive deep into the social sector, gain knowledge on a range of social issues and the personal quality of "grit", and to achieve valuable personal growth.

Criteria of Participant:

- 1. Must be between 20 to 25 years old
- 2. Must commit to one-year participation

Preferred Personal Qualities:

- 1. Entrepreneurial
- 2. Socially attentive
- 3. Proactive and responsible
- 4. Positive and can-do attitude
- 5. Considerate of others and always be grateful

New Changes: Services Learning Online Courses

In collaboration with PEER in 2017, Grit Project (class of 2017) developed a total of 5 units and 100 hours of online "service-learning"courses in 3 months, including theoretical knowledge covering social transformation and civil charity, community building and citizenship and social innovation supplemented by numerous examples of non-profit institutions. These courses helped the youths build related knowledge systems on society and inspired their profound thinking on social issues.

"I always thought that people who appear to achieve less were due to lack of personal efforts. But now I understand the influence of unequal opportunities. For the amount of favorable opportunities I've recieved in the past, I now feel the obligation to do more for others."

New Experiences: Challenge Camp and Rural Volunteering

Together with PEER, Grit Project (class of 2017) set up a one-month Challenge Camp in addition on online training. The Challenge Camp included a oneweek intensive study camp and a three-week rural volunteering experience. During the study camp, more than 20 experts, scholars, and NGO leaders, including Ms. Xiaoyan Liang and many Ginkgo Fellows, were invited as lecturers. During the rural volunteering experience, participants travelled to one of nine project sites in Hunan, Guangxi, Guizhou, Zhejiang and Jilin. Topics such as community exploration, historical study, cultural integration, and education fairness were discussed.

New Opportunities: Social Enterprises and International Organizations

In 2017, social enterprise Beijing Weixi Agricultural Development Company (Ren Xiaomi) and international organization Save the Children provided suitable internship posts and one-on-one mentors for selected Grit Youths.



Young Social Entreprenuer Round Table



Introduction

Young Social Entrepreneur Round Table is a non-profit project launched by Ginkgo Foundation in April 2017 to support social innovation organizations in the initial stage (1-3 years). It aims to meet the challenges these organizations are facing through small grants, and the facilitation of dialogue and collaborations.

In 2017, 5 Round Table events were held, each with around 10 participants. A total of 20 young founders of start-up phase social innovation organizations had attended one or more events, including founders of Art Dream, SEO China, C Program, PEER, Philanthropy in Motion (PIM), MyH2O, SEED, and Tomoroe. At the same time, senior NGO and business leaders joined the Round Tables as advisors, including the founder of Ensan Foundation Hao Li, Ginkgo Fellows Nan Hao and Yang Qian, and the heads of Sany Foundation 3ESPACE Project, and project managers from Guangjian Laboratory.

Since 2016, Ginkgo Foundation started to help Ginkgo Fellows raise more public awareness and attract wider attention through a Photo Story Project.

In 2017, in cooperation with TaHoe Communication, Beijing Top Result Metro Advertising Company, and Mr. Andrew Wong, photojournalism director of Getty Images in Greater China region, Ginkgo Foundation made posters for nine Gingko Fellows which focus on "I want to go to school", "Join the Green Side", "Find the lost Khorchin", "Guard kelsang flowers in Tibet", and "Protect the Green Peafowl" concerning millions of people. In this way, the general public is able to access the photo stories of the 9 Ginkgo Fellows on their cellphones, in Metro stations and movie theaters nation-wide.

Initiated by Ginkgo Foundation and Swanport Culture, "Coffee with A Story" is a nation-wide event through which we bring stories of 9 Ginkgo Fellows and the Ginkgo Foundation into the daily lives of everyone.

Between September 1-9, 2017, posters of nine Ginkgo Fellows were seen in more than 210 public spaces across 26 provinces including cafes, bookstores, and youth hostels. Coffee and beverages were presented with storytransformed paper coasters, from which customers could read more into the stories and even make a donation through a QR code. At the same time, 500 theaters nationwide and over 40 metro stations in Beijing placed advertisements for these stories.

During the campaign, an estimated 300,000 people enjoyed the stories in metro stations and theaters, and online stories cummulated over 13,000 hits.

Project



Ginkgo Foundation and Ginkgo Fellows co-organized Ginkgo Social Innovation Pop-up Event to promote the social entrepreneurship to young audiences. The theme of Event was "STIR", which used the internal growth of a pre-germinating seed to symbolize the time and efforts required before major changes turn up.

The Event, held on November 5th in Beijing 77 Cultural and Creative Park, was a combination of storytelling, art exhibition and musical performance. Secretary General of the Ginkgo Foundation Hong Lin and seven Ginkgo Fellows shared their stories. More than 20 artists and writers participated in the art exhibition. The live musical was performed by 8772, a band established by members with rare diseases and disabilities.

This event attracted more than 500 live audience members and recieved 68,000 hits in NetEase live streaming, ranking first among programmes broadcast at the same time-slot. Moreover, 11 coffee shops located in cities such as Sichuan A'ba, Fujian Quanzhou and Anhui Ma' anshan live broadcasted the event to their customers.

我们审计了后附的北京市银杏公益基金会财务报表,包括 2017 年 12 月 31 日的资产负债表,2017 年度的业务活动表和现金流量表以及财务报表附注。

一、管理层对财务报表的责任

编制和公允列报财务报表是北京市银杏公益基金会管理层的责任,这种责任包括:(1)按照《民间非营利组织会计制度》的规定编制财务报表,并使其实现公允反映;(2)设计、执行和维护必要的内部控制,以使财务报表不存在由于舞弊或错误导致的重大错报。

我们相信,我们获取的审计证据是充分、适当的,为发表审计意见提供了 基础。
